Sponsors, please retrieve the invitation that your students receive with the trophies. It will give instructions on how to enter them in National competition.

Please make note that the entry and the registration for convention are two different things.

Access the National Bulletin for specific instructions on how to register for the convention and enter your students for competition. The National Bulletin can be found at sponsors.betaclub.org under the convention icon then bulletins. The National Bulletin also has the tentative schedule, competition rules, and hotel information. Please know that you can call the National Beta Club Office for help at any time.

The Deadline for completing the online entry for competitions is April 26, 2013. NO late entries will be accepted for any reason. You will receive an immediate email confirming your entry. If you do not, please contact the National Office.

Registration of \$25.00 for the National Convention is also April 26, 2013. After this date late registration is accepted for the convention (not competition entries) with the late fee of \$30.00.

CONVENTION INFORMATION ALABAMA JUNIOR BETA CLUB CONVENTION

- 1. Decide HOW and WHEN members will go to the Convention and WHERE the club will stay. Transportation will vary according to whether public transportation or cars are used. Figure costs and prorate them. Since each group arranges for its own lodging, you will need to know how many nights you will need lodging and what the total cost for this lodging will be. Include an estimated cost for meals. Add all of this to the PRE-REGISTRATION fee mentioned in the next paragraph, divide by the number of people attending, and you will have the total cost of the Convention per person. This does not include shopping, souvenirs or entrance fees to any places of interest your group may visit. Items bearing the Junior Beta Club Emblem will be available at the convention. Students may desire to purchase these items. To insure that they will have sufficient funds to make these purchases, please advise them these items will be available.
- 2. Voting will be done by grade master ballots. Students must use a # 2 pencil. Clubs are responsible for bringing their own pencils.
- 3. If any rule is broken, the student and/ or club will be ineligible to place in the competition or points will be deducted from judging score.
- 4. THE PRE-REGISTRATION FEE is \$20.00 per Junior Beta attending the Convention, which admits registrants to all Convention functions, including the dance. EVERYONE MUST REGISTER! This fee is used to defray the costs of the Conventions--facilities, printing of programs, name badges, etc. Adult chaperones are also asked to register so that a correct count of attendance may be made, and in case of sickness, calls, etc. can be referred. Chaperones and guests registering at the convention will be charged a \$5.00 registration fee. Since admission to meetings is by name badge only, all the chaperones and guest should register. There will be no refunds.
- **5.** New Policy passed by the Board of directors at the 2009 National Convention concerning refunds: There will be no state or National convention registrations refunds for any reason unless the convention is canceled by the National Office.
- 6. REGISTRATION: The registration is now online at <u>sponsors.betaclub.org</u>
 The online registration form must be completed, submitted, printed and mailed with the registration fee to the National Office by the postmark deadline date of February 11, 2013.
- **7. ENTRY TO THE DANCE** is included in the registration fee. Dress must be in good taste. Girls usually wear dresses and boys wear nice slacks and a shirt. STUDENTS WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE IF THEY ARE NOT DRESSED ACCORDINGLY. Sponsors need to address this issue before arriving at the convention.
- **8. MEALS:** Most clubs that raise Convention money use this to pay for registration, lodging and/or transportation costs. Each student usually pays for his/her own meals.

- **9. SPONSORS:** Each club usually pays the Convention expenses of their chaperones, the Sponsor, school officials, or whoever is kind enough to come with them. One Sponsor from each club MUST ATTEND the Sponsors' meeting on Thursday. It is recommended that each club have one Sponsor or adult chaperone for every fifteen members.
- **10. REGISTER EARLY!** ENCLOSE THE ONLINE REGISTRATION FORM WITH A LIST OF JUNIOR BETAS ATTENDING AND A SCHOOL CHECK FOR **\$20.00** for each member. Chaperones and guests registering at the convention will be charged a \$5.00 registration fee.

Registration should be postmarked by February 11, 2013. Late registration fee will be \$25.00 per Beta Club member.

- 11. MAKE HOTEL RESERVATIONS EARLY! It is not necessary to send advance hotel registration for the Junior Beta Convention to the National Office, but many hotels and motels ask for a confirmation deposit. When you arrange for your lodging, ask for WRITTEN CONFIRMATION of rooms and EXACT RATES. If possible, give the exact number of boys, girls, and chaperones, indicating how many will occupy rooms together. The cost is determined by the number in a room. A hotel rooming and rate form is included in this packet. It is courteous and greatly appreciated to cancel any extra hotel reservations you may have as soon as you know about this. In like manner, if more Junior Betas decide to go than you had reservations for, notify the hotel or motel so they can better help you with your accommodations.
 - A. **SPECIAL NEEDS:** It is the National Beta Club's intention to make this convention as pleasant as possible for all attendees. Please let us know if there are any special accommodations you need so we may, if reasonably possible, attempt to make appropriate arrangements. You must notify us at The National Beta Club, 151 Beta Club Way, Spartanburg, South Carolina 29306-3012 by no later than February 11, 2013. Your failure to timely notify us may result in our inability to accommodate your needs.
- **12. NATIONAL RULES:** In June of 1999, the Board of Directors approved the following rules:
 - A. All convention attendees and competitors must be official members registered with the National Beta Club by the registration deadline date of your convention. This means student(s) entering any of the competitions or running for office must be members at the time of the deadline date of your convention. Entry forms that are sent to the National Office that do not meet requirements will not be accepted and will be returned to you.
 - B. All Junior Beta Club candidates must be returning to a school that has an active Junior Beta Club and must have the written permission of the administration and sponsor of the school(s) involved. Be sure all forms are completed and sent to the correct address.

- **13. ARTS & CRAFTS:** Only the sponsor or an adult chaperone may drop off the arts, crafts, banners or scrapbooks that will be judged. These rooms will be closed for viewing until the judging is complete. In addition, the rooms will only be open for viewing after the completion of the second session.
- **14.** All trophies not picked up during the awards ceremony will be shipped to the sponsor per their request COD.
- 15. An invitation to all winners to compete at the National Convention in Mobile, Alabama will be given with the trophies. However, the official competition entry form will be found at sponsors.betaclub.org The sponsor will need to complete and submit the form online by the deadline date of April 26, 2013. If you do not receive this email, contact the National Office.

CODE OF CONDUCT ALABAMA JUNIOR BETA CLUB CONVENTION

Knowing an organization is judged largely by the behavior of its individual members, we, who attend the Junior Beta Club Convention, agree that our registering at the State Convention constitutes our subscribing to the following rules, which comprise the Code of Conduct. Failure to abide by any of these rules will result in removal from competitions and the convention.

- **Rule 1: EACH SPONSOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR** each and every one of his/her students. Therefore, students must keep their Sponsor informed of their whereabouts at all times.
- **Rule 2:** Betas registered at the Convention should be present for all scheduled meetings and on time. If you do not arrive at a meeting and miss important information or fail to pick it up, do not contact the State officials for the information missed. Again, you must be present for all scheduled meetings.
- **Rule 3:** Curfew is promptly at 11:30 PM unless the Council Chairman announces otherwise. This means in own room and respectfully quiet.
- **Rule 4:** Members may visit other members' rooms prior to curfew and only with the Sponsor's knowledge and approval.
- **Rule 5:** No alcoholic beverages, tobacco products or drugs, in any form, shall be possessed by anyone at the State Beta Convention. Clothing which advertises sex, drugs, alcohol, or violence will not be permitted.
- **Rule 6:** All registered Betas are expected to wear official name badges on their chest at all times.
- **Rule 7:** Each registered Beta is expected to display and exert leadership qualities in a responsible manner that will lead to the organized success of this Convention. Betas should conduct themselves in such a manner that their actions will reflect favorably on the school and community and all of those responsible for providing the student with this opportunity.

We agree that any violation of these rules subjects our entire chapter to being sent home and all honors and awards forfeited. Serious misconduct on our part shall be reported to our Principal and our parents who shall be advised that we are barred from participating in future Beta Conventions and shall constitute grounds for the cancellation of our school's charter in The National Junior Beta Club.

NOMINATION FOR STATE OFFICERS ALABAMA JUNIOR BETA CLUB CONVENTION

- I. In June of 2005, the Board of Directors approved the following rule: Junior State Officers shall be elected from current seventh or eighth grade Beta Club members and will hold office for one year. No officer shall serve more than one term in any office as a Junior Beta Club member.
- II. ELIGIBILITY: Nominee must be a Junior Beta member that meets the above criteria and is in good standing, officially enrolled at the National Office by February 11, 2013, and duly registered at the Convention. The candidate must give notice of his/her candidacy to the National Office postmarked by February 11, 2013 and must comply with the following rules and regulations. A club may nominate for one office only. The offices are (1) President, (2) Vice President, (3) Secretary, (4) Reporter, and (5) Chaplain.
 - A. The nomination must be approved by the Sponsor and the Executive Head of the candidate's school.
 - B. EACH CANDIDATE MUST BE RETURNING TO AN ACTIVE JUNIOR BETA CLUB AND HAVE WRITTEN APPROVAL OF PRINCIPALS AND SPONSORS INVOLVED. CANDIDATES MUST ALSO BE OFFICIAL MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL BETA CLUB AND THE NOMINATING CLUB BY THE DEADLINE OF February 11, 2013. The candidate must sign a pledge stating that he/she will attend all of the meetings and sessions of the convention, including the installation ceremony, and will fulfill ALL of the duties of the office the following year. This means he/she is obligated to attend the entire Convention both years when nominated and when serving as a state officer. Failure to obey these rules will result in their removal from office and any future candidate office.
 - C. If elected and for some reason unable to serve, the runner-up shall fill the vacancy. It is imperative for an elected officer to notify the State Sponsor and the National Sponsor immediately if he/she cannot serve.
 - D. No nominations from the floor or "write-in" candidates will be permitted. Nominations will be closed officially February 11, 2013, unless a candidate is unopposed. In that event, the nominations will be reopened for that office until two weeks after deadline date.
 - E. Each candidate must send a copy of their speech and skit to the state sponsor no later than February 11, 2013.
- III.SUGGESTIONS AND DUTIES: State officers, their Sponsors, coordinators of the competitions, and the National Beta officials participate in the planning of the annual state convention. The State Sponsor and Sponsor-Elect will serve as chairpersons. The President will preside over the first general session, the Vice President will preside over the second general session, and the Secretary will preside over the third general session. The Reporter leads in the Pledge of Allegiance during the first session and shall make all necessary announcements. The Chaplain gives the inspirations at each general session.

Any violations of the following rules will result in losing a percentage of votes.

Campaigning

- 1. No handouts, balloons, food products, band, tape players, radio, VCR, horns, or any other noise makers.
- 2. Betas from the candidate's club only may wear the t-shirts and be involved in the skit.
- **3.** Campaign T-Shirts may be worn at anytime during the convention.
- **4. No chanting** is to take place at anytime.
- 5. NO Costumes are to be worn and NO placards may be carried EXCEPT during the skit!

Speeches

- 1. Time limit of two (2) minutes.
- 2. The candidate will not speak after the 2 minute whistle is blown.
- **3.** Deliverance of speech must not be suggestive in anyway. (No sexual connotations)
- **4.** NO singing, rapping, costuming, props, slides, videos, inappropriate gestures during the speech or question/answer segment.
- 5. The speech should have substance and <u>not</u> be a list of your qualifications **nor contain** references to flirting (i.e., "See you at the dance," "Here's my phone number," or "I'm available.")
- **6.** Content must not have reference to or use of alcohol, gambling, drugs, tobacco, use of and/or portrayal of guns, real knives and swords, very sharp pointed objects, sex, bathroom humor, violence, underclothing, race, R-rated movies, etc.
- 7. The candidate's slogan, movie references or the original version of the chosen song MUST not refer to alcohol, drugs, sex, race, or make use of inappropriate language.
- 8. The candidates' speeches will be judged by the campaign skit judges.

The judging criteria are:

- Slogan 20 points
 - Slogan is specific, appropriate and adapted to the candidate's choice of slogan for the office they wish to hold.
- Expressions 20 points
 - Body Language, gestures, and facial expressions add greatly to the message.
 Candidate should show enthusiasm and energy throughout the speech.
- Organization/Transition 20 points
 - The candidate makes smooth transitions during parts of the speech. There are not unnecessary pauses or delays.
- Verbal Support 20 points
 - The speech is spoken clearly and distinctly; No mispronounced words; can be heard by the audience and is easy to understand and comprehend.
- Eve Support 20 points

The candidate has good eye contact with the audience.

Dress Code

- 1. Young ladies must wear a dressy pantsuit with coordinating long sleeve jacket or business suit.
- 2. The length of the business suit skirt must be below the knee, with a front, side or back slit no longer than 2" above the knee.
- 3. The dressy pantsuit pants must be to the top of the shoes. Crop pants must not be worn.
- **4.** Jacket's sleeve must be to the wrist.
- **5.** No low cut or tight fitting, strapless or spaghetti strap tops will be allowed.
- **6.** The young men must wear a suit or jacket with dress slacks, a tie, collared dress shirt and dress shoes.

Question/Answer Segment

- 1. Each candidate will answer an impromptu question.
- 2. One (1) minute time limit to answer the question.
- **3.** Candidate must stop when the one minute whistle is blown.
- **4.** Each candidate will draw a question from a pool of questions.
- **5.** Prior to the session, each candidate will be given an opportunity to see the entire pool of questions.
- **6.** Timing starts after the question has been read.

Skit

- 1. A one minute promotional skit will follow the speech only at the Campaign session. Skit participants must stop when the one minute whistle is blown.
- **2.** The dress for participants in the skit must be appropriate.
- **3.** (No strapless, low-cut or spaghetti strap tops, no midriffs showing, no skin tight clothing, and no short shorts. Shorts must be worn under very short skirts.
- **4.** The candidate will not take part in the promotional skit.
- 5. No balloons, hay, confetti, or fire in the skits.
- **6.** Cheerleading stunts without mats are not recommended.
- 7. Nothing thrown from the stage into the audience.
- 8. The candidate and skit participants must remain on stage during the skit.
- 9. Skits must not have reference to or use of alcohol, gambling, drugs, tobacco, sex, bathroom humor, violence, underclothing, race, etc. Be careful of R-rated movies, music, commercial, etc that are chosen for skit. The candidate's slogan, movie references or the original version of the chosen song MUST not refer to alcohol, drugs, sex, race, or make use of inappropriate language.
- **9.** No inappropriate dance moves or gestures.
- 10. Black lights are discouraged due to the inability to turn off lights at the convention sites.
- 11. No use of and/or portrayal of guns, real knives or swords or very sharp pointed objects.
- 12. Removal of clothing will not be allowed on stage.

Voting

- 1. Grade master ballots will be used.
- 2. Voting will be by candidate number as printed in the program, not by name.

If there are infractions of the above stated candidate rules, a deduction of votes will occur as follows:

- Inappropriate speech or skit which includes the following: 75%
 - Sexual gestures or connotations
 - Inappropriate dance moves or gestures
 - Reference to alcohol, drugs and tobacco
 - Use of and/or portrayal of guns, real knives or swords and very sharp pointed objects.
 - Reference to gambling, bathroom humor, underclothing sex or race
 - Use of inappropriate songs, dance moves, <u>R-rated movies</u>, etc. <u>The candidate's slogan, movie references or the original version of the chosen song MUST not refer to alcohol, drugs, sex, race, or make use of inappropriate language.</u>
 - Removal of clothing while on stage.
- All other infractions 25% of votes per rule infraction

A committee made up of Alabama Beta Club Council Chair, a Council Member and the Alabama State Junior Beta Sponsor will rule on any loss of vote total of a candidate.

TALENT COMPETITION RULES ALABAMA JUNIOR BETA CLUB CONVENTION

- 1. Only Betas who are officially enrolled at the National Office by the deadline of February 11, 2013 and are registered at the convention may take part in the program. All talent participant(s) name(s) must be on the talent entry form, or the entry form will be returned, making your club ineligible to perform. Clubs must furnish their own properties.
- 2. Clubs must furnish their own properties. A piano, sound system, and CD player are provided. Any music used for talent must be put on a CD and given to talent coordinator prior to the beginning of the session. Please label the CD with school name, performer(s) name, and title of music. A preliminary competition for talent will be held on the first day. The top five Group acts will perform the first day, and the top eight Special acts will perform the second day.
- 3. Twenty points (20) from final score will be deducted from any performance exceeding the time limits.
- 4. Group acts (5 or more participants) 6-minute limit. Please keep set up times to a minimum, remembering that those advancing to the National Convention must adhere to the set up time rule.
- 5. Special acts (4 or fewer participants) 4-minute limit
- 6. CD for vocal entries must contain music only. (This means no words or computerized/synthesized voices on CD.)
- 7. NO LIP SYNCING ALLOWED. CD'S for vocal entries must contain music only. (This means no words or computerized/synthesized voices on disc.)

- **10.** Only participants in the group and special talent competition may attend a short rehearsal at a specified time. This will ensure that all participants have prepared quality performances within the specified time limits.

The stage is 32' wide, 40' long and 4' high. There will be stairs to enter/exit on one side and a ramp on the other side. Only microphones and headsets that are provided by the Audio Visual Company hired by National Office may be used.
- 12. No use of and/or portrayal of guns, real knives or swords, or very sharp pointed objects.
- 13. The use of black lights are discouraged due to the inability to turn off lights at the convention sites.

- **14.** All entries must be postmarked by February 11, 2013. Any talent entry postmarked after February 11, 2013 will not be accepted and will be returned. A school may enter either the group talent or the special talent, **NOT BOTH**. A school may have only one talent entry.
- 15. NO FIRE, HAY, CONFETTI, OR BALLOONS MAY BE USED IN ANY ACT!

- **3.** The banner is to measure 24" W x 36" L including fringe. (1/2" more or less will be allowed for shrinkage or stretching.)



ESSAY COMPETITION RULES ALABAMA JUNIOR BETA CLUB CONVENTION

- 1. Subject: The Heart of Beta
- 2. Deadline: Essays must be postmarked no later than **February 11, 2013**.
- 3. Each school may enter one individual essay written by a Junior Beta.
- **4. Length of Essay:** Limit the essay from 600-1000 words. Count the words and note the total number of words at the end of the essay. Every word will be counted except dates (such as March 1, 1981), which will be counted as one word only. Do not exceed the word limit.
- **5.** Essays must be typed and double spaced.
- **6. Bibliography**: All essays should include a bibliography with the essay if material from books, pamphlets, letters, newspapers, etc. is used.
- 7. Title Page: Title Page to include ONLY the title of the essay, student's name, School name and address, and the name of the sponsor. Nothing else should appear on the title page. Lack of these items result in point deductions.
- 8. The essay and 3 copies along with the essay form must be sent with the Competition Entry Form. (A total of 4 copies of the essay with a title page for each copy.)
- **9.** Failure to comply with these rules will result in elimination from competition or points deducted.
- 10. All essays will be judged by a panel of impartial individuals.

LIVING LITERATURE COMPETITION RULES ALABAMA JUNIOR BETA CLUB CONVENTION

The Living Literature competition provides an opportunity for students to present their interpretation of a scene from a favorite work of literature.

- 1. Each school may have one entry, either an individual or a group of several students.
- 2. Students should choose an actual scene and characters from any form of literature, including a novel, short story, poem or play. Be careful not to use a scene from a movie that is not actually in the literature. Students recreate the scene through costumes, scenery and props (no music or sound effects will be allowed). Essentially, students become "wax museum figures" of the characters. Visitors will stroll through the "museum."
- **3.** A poster should be made providing a short description of the scene, title, author and school. (standard poster board size). **Poster must be within the dimensions of the scene.**
- **4.** The dimension of a scene may not exceed 10 feet wide by 12 feet deep.
- 5. All attempts will be made to have areas taped for scene set up on Wednesday evening by 8:00 PM. All participating clubs may set up if they wish anytime after that deadline. No assembly will allowed during General Sessions prior to the competition or after 3:45 PM on Thursday.
- 6. Schools should be set up for Living Literature by the 3:45 PM on Thursday for judging.
- 7. At the National Convention, Only 2 adults and Beta Members may help the competition participants set up the scenery and must leave room after set up. Sponsors, Remember this is a student competition. Adults are able to advise the students but must not be the primary construction team.
- 8. <u>At the National Convention</u>, Set up time will be limited to <u>30 minutes</u>. Competitors <u>must</u> adhere to set up times or they will be ineligible to place in the competition.
- 9. Students elevated off the floor (i.e., on a ladder, on top of a scene, etc.) must be secured to prevent a fall. Please remind your student not to lock their knees.
- 10. Entire scene should be entirely free standing, not leaning on walls. No electricity will be provided.
- 11. Entrants must be set up and "ready to freeze" by the designated time to qualify for judging.
- **12.** A number will be assigned for each entry before convention by the coordinator.
- 13. No part of the scenery should move during pose for judging.
- 14. No moving object, live animals, fire, hay, confetti, mannequins or music in the scene.

- 15. There will be a public viewing 30 minutes after the judging. The viewing will take place in four 5-minute increments with a 3-minute break between each. After a 3-minute break participants must resume their original pose. Participants are encouraged to bring bottle water for breaks because they will not be allowed to leave the room.
- **16.** Entrants must clean their assigned scene area and remove all props **immediately** after the competition is over.

- **5.** Only one student per school can enter.

- **7. Judging**: All poems will be judged by a panel of impartial individuals.

- 1. Posters will be created on site. Students should report to the designated room on Thursday.
- **2.** Teams of 2 to 4 students will design an original poster on a theme to be assigned at the beginning of the competition.
- **3.** Teams may use only the following items and <u>must provide their own:</u>
 - 1 sheet of WHITE poster board (white, 14" by 22")
 - Pencils and erasers
 - Colored markers (any size) brown, black, yellow, orange, purple, red, blue, green
- **4.** Students will have one hour to complete their poster.
- **5.** All posters will be judged by a panel of impartial individuals.
- **6.** Theme does not have to be written on poster.
- **7.** Theme will be assigned at the beginning of the competition.

Adherence to theme 20 pts.

How is the artwork related to the topic? Does it make a strong connection to the theme?

• Creativity 20 pts.

How does the poster reflect the students' creativity?

• Originality 20 pts. How unique is the interpretation of the theme?

QUIZ BOWL COMPETITION RULES ALABAMA JUNIOR BETA CLUB CONVENTION

- 1. Each school will be permitted to have one team enter the Quiz Bowl. A team will be made up of four (4) students. All team members must be members of the Beta Club they represent.
- **2.** An alternate may be substituted on the team up to the time of the written portion of the competition.
- 3. After the written competition, there will be no substitutions permitted.
- **4.** In the event a qualifying team member is unable to participate in the oral round, his/her team have two options: withdraw from the competition or continue with the remaining members.
- 5. The postmark deadline for entry in the Quiz Bowl is **February 11, 2013.**
- **6.** All schools are eligible to participate in the Quiz Bowl competition. No school or schools will be ineligible because they are in charge of the competition. It is the feeling of the committee that there should be no problems with this because the Sponsors will be in charge of formulating the quiz teams.
- 7. The four official members of a team will take a written test short answer to determine the two teams qualifying for the final round. The team as a unit will take the test; only one answer sheet will be filled in for scoring.
- **8.** Questions in both the written and oral rounds are from the following subject areas:

Social Studies

Language Arts

Natural and Physical Sciences

Mathematics

Fine Arts (including painting, sculpture, music)

Current Events (those occurring within the last year)

Health and Physical Education, Sports, and Games

State Government

Trivia

9. If there are no more than three (3) teams entering the Quiz Bowl competition, the written test will be eliminated and a drawing of schools will be done to determine which schools will compete against each other in the oral competition.

Written Test

- 1. A team of four will work on the test together.
- 2. Scores on the written test will be determined from the total number of correct answers.
- 3. The two teams with the highest scores will be the finalists for the oral competition.
- **4.** To break ties for the two-team qualifiers for the final round, the time the answer sheets are turned in will be used.
- **5.** The entrants will be allowed one (1) hour to complete the written test.
- **6.** Protests on the written competition must be registered with the judges within one (1) hour after the posting of the results.
- 7. The decision of the judges will be final.

Oral Competition

- 1. Only team members who have taken the written test will be permitted to compete in the oral competition.
- 2. Only the teams and their coaches are allowed in the rooms during the oral competition.
- **3.** The first place qualifying team will compete with the second place qualifying team, the third place team will be invited to complete at the National Convention.
- **4.** Each team will select a captain to represent the team and give the answers on the bonus questions. Only the team captain or the coach may address the
- **5.** No calculators can be used in the competition; however, pads and pencils will be supplied for the competitors.
- **6.** Questions will vary in difficulty. They will range from the trivial to the highly technical. They will be compiled by an outside testing agency from school texts, current news, trivia books, standardized tests, quiz bowl books, etc. There are no specific sources from which you can study. This is general knowledge competition, which stresses quick recall.
- 7. If a team is late or fails to appear at all, it will forfeit the match and the remaining teams will compete. There will be no rearrangement of the schedule. (Designated lateness will be 5 minutes after the starting time.)
- **8.** The match will consist of two teams and will be played in one round consisting of twenty (20) questions.
- **9.** The team with the highest score at the end of twenty (20) questions will be declared the winner of that match.
- **10.** There are two types of questions used in the competition, "Toss-up" and "Bonus."
- **11.** A "Toss-up" question generally has only one part and is worth ten points (10). Any team member may respond to a "Toss-up" question. The participant, who buzzes first, when recognized by the moderator, has five (5) seconds to respond to the question. NO conference between team members is allowed on a "Toss-up" question.
- **12.** If the respondent answers a "Toss-up" question incorrectly, the opposing team gets five (5) seconds to respond with the correct answer.

- 13. A "Bonus" question generally has a value of twenty (20) points and may range from a single answer to a question involving multiple parts with a value of five (5) or ten (10) points assigned to each post. Bonus questions vary in degree of difficulty. Conference among team members, who have answered the "Toss-up" question and earned the "Bonus" question, IS ALLOWED. The "bonus" response must come from the designated Team Captain who will speak for the team.
- **14.** If a "Bonus" is incorrectly answered, it will NOT be offered to the other team.
- 15. The moderator will read the "Bonus" question through once in its entirety. Immediately, upon the completion of reading the question, a twenty (20) second timer will begin. At the end of 15 seconds, the timer will say "five", which means the team, has five (5) seconds to begin giving the answer to the bonus. When the full twenty (20) seconds has expired, the timer will call "time" and no answers will be accepted.
- **16.** If the Team Captain is ready to respond before the allowed time is up, he/she may signal by saying "ready" to the moderator.
- 17. The moderator will not indicate whether answers are correct or incorrect until response to all multiple parts is completed, at which time, he/she will note the points awarded and provide any answers not given. He/she will then immediately move on to the next "Toss-up" question.

18. In Case of a Tie:

If competition should end in a tie, a "sudden death" situation using only "Toss-up" questions will occur. The team who scores FIRST will be declared the winner of the game. All previous rules for the "Toss-up" questions will apply.

19. The Decision:

The judges and the judges alone will maintain the score and determine whether the answers to questions are acceptable and if they are given in the appropriate time allowed. ALL DECISIONS BY THE JUDGES WILL BE FINAL.

20. PROTESTS: If a player or team wishes to protest either an accepted answer to a question or a game procedure, the protest must come during the game at the time of the occurrence from the team captain ONLY. A decision will be made at the point by the moderator and judge and it will be final. If a team has had two unsuccessful protests in one game, it may not make any further protests during the game.

SCHOLASTIC COMPETITIONS RULES ALABAMA JUNIOR BETA CLUB CONVENTION

General Rules and Regulations

- 1. The exam will have a time limit of one hour.
- **2.** Each participant must bring two (2) #2 pencils and an eraser.
- **3.** The time each participant finishes the test will be recorded. In case of a tie, the participant who finished the test first will be declared the winner.
- **4.** Winners of each competition will be awarded an invitation to compete at the National Convention.
- **5.** Each Exam will be compiled from the ALABAMA Course of Study Objectives.
- **6.** No outside resources will be allowed during the test. This includes calculators, slide rules, dictionaries, or any other type of reference material.

SCRAPBOOK COMPETITION RULES ALABAMA JUNIOR BETA CLUB CONVENTION

ALL SCRAPBOOKS MUST BE TURNED DURING THE DESIGNATED TIME ACCORDING TO THE PROGRAM. Only schools registered at the Convention are eligible to participate.

- 1. Only one (1) scrapbook per club may be entered into competition. There is no form for this competition. Simply place an "X" beside Scrapbook on the Competition Entry Form.
- 2. The scrapbook **must** cover only one year, convention-to-convention.
- 3. All work is to be done only by Beta members with the supervision of the Sponsor.
- **4.** The material is to be enclosed in a hardback cover. The name of the school and the organization may be used on the cover if desired.
- 5. NO stands or display boxes. Only a scrapbook is to be entered.
- **6.** The first page of the scrapbook must contain only **the name of the school, city and state**. (Title Page)
- 7. The scrapbook **must** contain a table of contents.
- **8.** The theme for the scrapbook must be **The Heart of Beta**
- **9.** The contents of the scrapbook may include: (a) School Service Projects; (b) Community Service Projects; (c) Interclub Service Projects; (d) Social Functions; (e) Original Categories (unique to the school); (f) Beta members in other school related activities.
- **10.** All newspaper clippings should be identified as to source and date.
- 11. Staples and tape should not be used to secure materials (use glue or special materials).
- **12.** The scrapbook should be simple to handle--pages easily turned, etc. It might be helpful to remember that the judges are not personally familiar with your school. The entries must be understandable to a person outside your organization.
- 13. The scrapbook should not exceed 24" by 24" by 12", or points will be deducted.
- 14. Scrapbooks will be on display for viewing. Monitors will be assigned to the area for supervision.
- **15.** Awards will be given to the top winners and a certificate of participation will be presented to each club participating.

2. No Medleys

- 3. The Songfest entry must follow the Convention Theme- The Heart of Beta. The theme interpretation MUST be evident throughout the song's lyrics.
- **4.** Do not use the club's name in the lyrics.
- 5. Lyrics to the original song <u>and</u> lyrics of the new song must be typewritten and submitted with the entry form. <u>The original version of the chosen song MUST not refer to alcohol, drugs, sex, race, or make use of inappropriate language. Points will be deducted if the song does not meet these requirements.</u>
- 6. No props, <u>Stationary movement will be allowed. This means that the student's feet MUST remain in place during the performance. Examples of stationary movement are, but not limited to, clapping, finger snapping, swaying, and simple gestures that enhance the lyrics.</u>
- **7.** Only matching shirts, pants, shorts, skirts or school uniforms will be allowed.
- **8.** The club competing should send a copy of the Original and New Lyrics by the deadline date to the State Sponsor.

- **9.** The Songfest Competition will be held immediately following the Group Talent Preliminary Competition on Thursday morning. The top three winners will perform in random order on Thursday evening during the Second General Session.
- **10.** Length of the song may not exceed three minutes. On stage presentation may not exceed five minutes including set up and break down. Violation of this rule will result in deduction of points.
- **11.** Fifty percent (50%) of your Beta students registered at convention must participate in the competition.
- 12. NO LIP SYNCING WILL BE ALLOWED.
- **13.** NO BACKGROUND VOCALS ON SOUNDTRACK. (This means no words or computerized/synthesized voices on CD.)

- **14.** The club may not sing with a CD that has background vocals on it (music only) during their convention presentation.
- **15.** Failure to comply with these rules will result in points being deducted.
- **16.** The Songfest competition will be judged by a panel of three judges and NOT by audience applause.

SPELLING BEE COMPETITION RULES ALABAMA JUNIOR BETA CLUB CONVENTION

- 1. Words shall be pronounced according to the diacritical markings in the Merriam Webster Dictionary from which the pronouncer, with the approval of the judges, may give a fuller explanation of the meaning of a word to supplement the dictionary definition(s) quoted.
- **2.** After the pronouncer gives the contestant a word, the contestant must pronounce the word correctly before and after spelling it.
- **3.** Having started to spell a word, a contestant may stop and start over, retracing the spelling from the beginning, but in the retracing, there can be no change of letters or sequence from those first pronounced. If letters or their sequences are changed in the respelling, the speller will be eliminated.
- **4.** After missing the spelling of a word, the contestant immediately drops out of the competition. The next word on the pronouncer's list is given to the next contestant.
- 5. When the contestants are reduced to two, the elimination procedure changes. At that point, when one contestant misspells a word, the other contestant shall be given an opportunity to spell that same word. If the second contestant spells that word correctly, plus the next word on the pronouncer's list, then the second contestant shall be declared the champion.
- **6.** If one of the two spellers misses and the other, after correcting the error, misspells the new word submitted to him/her, then the misspelled new word shall be referred to the first speller. If the first speller then succeeds in correcting the error and correctly spells the next word on the pronouncer's list, then he/she shall be declared champion.
- 7. If both spellers misspell the same word, both shall continue in the competition, and the one who misspelled the word shall be given a new word to spell. The competition shall then continue under rules 5 and 6.
- **8.** Level of difficulty will be changed with the beginning of a new round.
